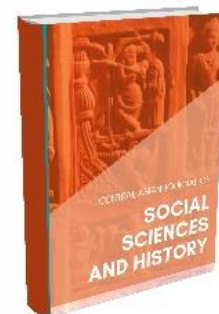




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Focus on Cultural Heritage and Reforms in the Field

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Annotation:

This convenient geographical location plays an important role in the development of international relations, which today is still a bridge between distant and distant countries. Today, Uzbekistan is presenting itself to the world as a peace-loving state with a rich history of foreign policy and cultural relations, and independently pursuing modern diplomatic relations. On the basis of the organization and development of Uzbekistan's foreign relations, Uzbekistan adheres to the following basic principles developed in the early days of independence:

- comprehensive consideration of mutual interests, giving priority to the interests of their national state;
- equality and mutual benefit, non-interference in the internal affairs of other countries;
- openness to cooperation, commitment to universal values, peace, stability and security, regardless of ideological views;
- the supremacy of international law over domestic law;
- Development of foreign relations on a bilateral and multilateral basis.

We believe that this is the decisive condition for the successful implementation of the most important priorities, the main goal of which is the reform of our country, the provision of human needs and interests [2.8].

is noteworthy that close cooperation with UNESCO has been established and is developing from year to year. In 1993, a year later, the National Commission of Uzbekistan for UNESCO was established in our country, which is a member of UNESCO. According to the decision of UNESCO, an international project on a comprehensive study of the Great Silk Road is being implemented. It is noteworthy that the project implements two programs in the field of human resources, environment, land and sea resources, as well as cultural development. According to F. Major, former Director-General of UNESCO, “the Silk Road, which passed through the desert and the seas, greatly contributed to the restoration of communication and communication between peoples, and contributed to the mutual enrichment of great civilizations” [4.121].

The Resolution of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan dated August 27, 2018 "On measures for the innovative development of culture and art in the Republic of Uzbekistan" hinders the further development of culture and art in this area aimed at overcoming a number of systemic problems and shortcomings.

recent years, comprehensive measures have been taken in our country to raise the spiritual and educational level of our people, strengthen the material and technical base of cultural and art institutions, and support the industry. In particular, the Public Fund "Ilhom" for the support of artists of Uzbekistan, the Fund for the Development of Culture and Arts under the Ministry of Culture of the Republic of Uzbekistan, the State Philharmonic of Uzbekistan, the Uzbek State Arts and Culture Fergana regional branch of the Institute of Culture was established.
