

II. METHODS

Regarding the reasons for the difficulties mentioned above, the data showed that the lack of resources (books, articles, audio and visual aids, online websites) ranked very high, followed by low English proficiency. ". "Lack of opportunities for writing practice" was the most prominent reason that prevented graduate students from mastering academic writing. Although lack of motivation and ineffective feedback provided by instructors were cited as the main reasons for academic writing deficiencies by undergraduate students, they agreed Lack of opportunities for students to practice writing and lack of resources (books, articles, audio and visual aids, online websites) were among the factors that did not help them acquire academic writing skills [4]. There are a range of books and online resources that provide data about how to write a cool academic writing, however, very few of them are authentic. So giving trustful reference books and articles is the main responsibility of teachers, since many may believe what Internet finds for them.

IV. DISCUSSION

The problem students often face in using appropriate academic vocabulary is the overuse of generic words. Students may rely on general words such as "good," "bad," "important," and "interesting" instead of using more precise and specific language. Excessive use of these words can make the writing repetitive and unoriginal. Students may use some words that are inappropriate for the context or audience. For example, using jargon or colloquial language in academic writing can make the writing look informal and unprofessional. So it is important that students understand the context and meaning of the words they use in their writing. To solve these problems, students can use a variety of strategies such as creating vocabulary, using synonyms and antonyms, reading academic texts, and consulting writing guides. By using these strategies, students can improve their use of appropriate academic vocabulary in their academic writing and produce high-quality work.

V. CONCLUSION

Difficulty choosing appropriate academic words, developing a thesis statement and organizing ideas, and writing coherent paragraphs were the most significant difficulties, while using grammar and writing mechanics had a slight negative impact on their academic writing. It can be concluded that the teaching method and lack of practice focused mainly on the end product were the main reasons for these difficulties. To help students acquire better academic writing skills, teachers should encourage students to read extensively to enrich their academic vocabulary and provide more opportunities for practice and give constructive and timely feedback. It is also recommended that students know their
